

Stations of the Cross

Station I: Matthew 27:22-23 Pilate said to them “Then what should I do with Jesus who is called the Messiah?” All of them said "Let him be crucified"

Reflection

Leader: Psalm 32: Blessed is he whose fault is taken away, whose sin is covered!

Response: I turn to you, Lord in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation!

Meditation: All say The Lord’s prayer.

Station II: John 19:17 They took Jesus, therefore, and he went out , bearing his own cross, to the Place of a Skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha.

Reflection

Leader: Psalm 32: Blessed is he whose fault is taken away, whose sin is covered!

Response: I turn to you, Lord in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation!

Meditation: All say The Lord’s prayer.

Station III: Jesus falls under the weight of the cross. He falls to the ground, he does not resort to the powers of the angels or calls upon his Heavenly Father.

Reflection

Leader: Psalm 32: Blessed is he whose fault is taken away, whose sin is covered!

Response: I turn to you, Lord in time of trouble, and you fill me with the joy of salvation!

Meditation: All say The Lord's prayer.

Station IV: Matthew 12:48-50 “Who is my mother and who are my brothers? Whoever does the will of my father in heaven is brother and sister and mother. Mary grieves for her son

Station V: Mark 15:21 Now Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and the soldiers forced him to carry the cross of Jesus

Station XI: I Peter 2:24 He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. Jesus is nailed to the cross

Station XIII: Psalm 22:14-15 I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint. My heart has turned to wax; it has melted within me. 15 My mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; you lay me in the dust of death. Jesus is taken down from the cross!
